HLT42015 Certificate IV in Massage Therapy

Course Overview

This qualification is suitable for students who are wishing work as a professional massage therapist in Australia. It provides students with skills in therapeutic relaxation massage as well as basic health assessment. It does not reflect the role of a remedial massage therapist.

Student who complete this course may decide to undertake further studies in the area of remedial massage such as the HLT52015 Diploma of Remedial Massage, or Chinese medicine such as the HLT52115 Diploma of Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM) Remedial Massage.

Course Duration & Delivery

The course is campus-based and includes practical clinic activities to be undertaken on campus at SITCM Teaching Clinic. It is delivered on a full-time basis over 24 weeks (2 terms). The course comprises of 14 weeks' face-to-face tuition (which includes theory classes and clinical practice), 4 weeks' intensive block practice, 2 weeks' assignment submission and 4 weeks' term break.

Training is conducted by face-to-face tuition in a classroom and clinic environment at the Dixon Street campus, and includes lectures, tutorials, class discussions, case scenarios, case histories, demonstrations, and practical on-site clinic activities. Students are also required to complete personal study time for each module of the program. The personal study can be conducted in any location, and SITCM will provide rooms and facilities if students wish to study on campus. All practical clinic activities are undertaken at SITCM Teaching Clinic. There is no work placement arrangement for this course.

Assessment

Assessment tasks include written tasks, demonstration, group work assignment and role play. Further evidence is gathered by clinic supervisors, who are also qualified assessors, who observe the student continuously whilst they are in the clinic. This allows the assessment of multiple skills and knowledge integrated into actual clinical massage activities and performance. Students will be required to complete a minimum of 44 client massage therapy treatments.

International applicants must have an IELTS score of 5.5 or above (or equivalent) and must provide documentation to that effect. Equivalent English language test scores include the following:

- Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) paper-based score of 527 or above; or internet-based test score of 46 or above;
- Cambridge English: Advanced (Certificate in Advanced English) score of 162 or above;
- Pearson Test of English (PTE) Academic score of 42 or above.

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Entry Requirements

All applicants must:

- Be 18 years of age or over at the time that they commence the course for which they have applied; and
- Provide a copy of their Australian Senior Secondary Certificate of Education (year 12 certificate) or evidence of successful completion of an Australian Qualification Framework (AQF) Certificate IV or higher qualification.
- If the applicant does not have an Australian year 12 Certificate or have not successfully completed an AQF Certificate IV or higher qualification, they are required to undertake a Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) test at SITCM and be assessed as competent at Exit Level 3 in the Australian Core Skills Framework in both reading and numeracy.



HLT52015 Diploma of Remedial Massage

This qualification is suitable for students who are wishing work as a professional remedial massage therapist; it provides students with advance massage and health assessment techniques for management of musculoskeletal and some chronic health conditions.

Students who complete this course may decide to undertake further studies in the area of Traditional Chinese medicine, such as the Bachelor of Traditional Chinese Medicine (BTCM).

Course Duration & Delivery

The program is campus-based and includes practical clinic activities to be undertaken on campus at SITCM Teaching Clinic. It is delivered on a full-time basis over 51 weeks (4 terms). The course comprises of 28 weeks' face-to-face tuition (which includes theory classes and clinical practice), 9 weeks' intensive block practice, 4 weeks' assignment submission and 10 weeks' holidays between terms.

Applicants who have completed post-secondary studies may request consideration for advanced standing towards the BTCM, Certificate IV in Massage Therapy, Diploma of Remedial Massage or Diploma of Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM) Remedial Massage. Applications for credit should include full documentation of previous studies, including unit descriptions. For more information and an application form for advanced standing please contact the Institute. Enrolling students can apply for **credit for prior learning** for whole units of study and up to a limit of 50% of the course they enrol in. Note that the awarding does not shorten the overall course duration as students will be required to participate in further practical clinic time due to the nature and structure of the courses.

Arrival and Orientation

If students are enrolled in the bachelor course, they are required to arrive one to two weeks prior to course commencement for enrolment and orientation programs. If students do not attend the study skills workshops and later in the semester require assistance, there will be a fee charged.

Attendance/Academic Performance

Regular attendance is a requirement for all students. All overseas students must attend a minimum of 80 per cent of classes to qualify for a certificate and meet student visa regulations. If students do not make satisfactory academic progress they may not be allowed to continue or to re-enrol.

Restrictions apply to international students who wish to change their education provider prior to completing six (6) months of their course of study with SITCM. For more information, please refer to the SITCM Student Manual available on http://www.sitcm.edu.au/.

Change of Address

International students are required notify the Institute within seven days of their change of address. Failure to do so may lead to the cancellation of their student visa.

Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)

It is an Australian Government requirement that international students studying on a student visa have compulsory Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for the duration of their stay in Australia. It is the student's responsibility to check the conditions of this health cover.

This fee is not payable to the Institute but to Australian Health Management Group (AHM) directly. We can arrange the cover for you on production of a completed application form and a bank draft or bank cheque payable to AHM for the appropriate premium.

The student will then be issued with a membership card upon processing of the application by AHM. OSHC for a single is \$1950*, and for a family \$22737* for a total of 4 years. These fees are payable in advance of the commencement of the courses.
